WARNINGS

- Aircraft / Vessel stores are goods under customs and biosecurity control and must not be removed without authority.
- It is an offence to make a false statement to the Department of Home Affairs. You may be penalised or prosecuted.
- Penalties for drug offences are severe in Australia.
- It is an offence to provide false or misleading information about goods you may be carrying, with "on the spot" fines of up to AUD\$420 or prosecution. In addition you may be prosecuted for undeclared goods imported in contravention of the *Biosecurity Act 2015*.
- Upon departure from Australia you must also declare to an officer of Customs if you are carrying AUD\$10,000 or more in Australian or foreign currency equivalent.
