

Australian Customs Notice No. 2022/54

Administrative changes to Certain Inputs to Manufacture Program

This Notice advises of administrative changes to the Certain Inputs to Manufacture (CIM) Program, administered by the Department of Industry, Science and Resources.

The Australian Government is committed to making cross-border trade easier for Australian businesses. As part of this ongoing commitment, changes have been made to the administration of the Certain Inputs of Manufacture program under items 46 and 47 of Schedule 4 of the *Customs Tariff Act 1995*. The changes are designed to lessen the administrative burden for importers, manufacturers, industry and government.

From 1 January 2023, all new CIM determinations issued to importers will no longer have an expiry date, and improvements have been made to the requirements for the technical report. All exisiting CIM determinations will expire as scheduled. Importers wishing to continue with the concession will need to re-apply.
