

## Australian Customs Notice No. 2023/04

## Customs (Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership - Entry into Force for Chile) Notice 2023

The Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP) will enter into force for Chile on 21 February 2023.

CPTPP entered into force for Australia, Canada, Japan, New Zealand, Mexico and Singapore on 30 December 2018, Vietnam on 14 January 2019, Peru on 19 September 2021 and Malaysia 29 November 2022.

Under subsection 153ZKU(6) of the *Customs Act 1901*, the Minister for Home Affairs is required to announce by notifiable instrument the day on which the Agreement enters into force for each Party to the Agreement (other than Australia).

This occurred on 5 February 2023 in <u>Customs (Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership—Entry into Force for Chile) Notice 2023</u>.

The following Preference Origin Country code is to be included with the table found in <u>ACN 2018/37</u> for use from 21 February 2023.
