

Australian Customs Notice No. 2023/18

Customs (Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement—Entry into Force for the Philippines) Notice 2023

The Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (RCEP) will enter into force for the Philippines on 2 June 2023.

The RCEP entered into force for Australia, Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, China, Japan, Lao PDR, New Zealand, Singapore, Thailand and Viet Nam on 1 January 2022, the Republic of Korea on 1 February 2022, Malaysia on 18 March 2022 and Indonesia on 2 January 2023.

Under subsection 153ZQB(6) of the *Customs Act 1901*, the Minister for Home Affairs is required to announce by notifiable instrument the day on which the Agreement enters into force for each Party other than Australia.

This occurred on 10 May 2023 in <u>Customs (Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement—Entry into Force for the Philippines) Notice 2023.</u>
