CHAPTER 3

Fish and crustaceans, molluscs and other aquatic invertebrates

- 0301 Live fish
- 0302 Fish, fresh or chilled, excluding fish fillets and other fish meat of 0304
- 0303 Fish, frozen, excluding fish fillets and other fish meat of 0304
- 0304 Fish fillets and other fish meat (whether or not minced), fresh, chilled or frozen
- 0305 Fish, dried, salted or in brine; smoked fish, whether or not cooked before or during the smoking process; flours, meals and pellets of fish, fit for human consumption
- ★ 0306 Crustaceans, whether in shell or not, live, fresh, chilled, frozen, dried, salted or in brine; smoked crustaceans, whether in shell or not, whether or not cooked before or during the smoking process; crustaceans, in shell, cooked by steaming or by boiling in water, whether or not chilled, frozen, dried, salted or in brine; flours, meals and pellets of crustaceans, fit for human consumption
- ★ 0307 Molluscs, whether in shell or not, live, fresh, chilled, frozen, dried, salted or in brine; smoked molluscs, whether in shell or not, whether or not cooked before or during the smoking process; flours, meals and pellets of moolluscs, fit for human consumption
- Aquatic invertebrates other than crustaceans and molluscs, live, fresh, chilled, frozen, dried, salted or in brine; smoked aquatic invertebrates other than crustaceans and molluscs, whether or not cooked before or during the smoking process; flours, meals and pellets of aquatic invertebrates other than crustaceans and molluscs, fit for human consumption

Notes.

- 1.- This Chapter does not cover:
 - (a) Mammals of 0106;
 - (b) Meat of mammals of 0106 (0208 or 0210);
 - (c) Fish (including livers and roes thereof) or crustaceans, molluscs or other aquatic invertebrates, dead and unfit or unsuitable for human consumption by reason of either their species or their condition (Chapter 5); flours, meals or pellets of fish or of crustaceans, molluscs or other aquatic invertebrates, unfit for human consumption (2301); or
 - (d) Caviar or caviar substitutes prepared from fish eggs (1604).
- 2.- In this Chapter, "pellets" means products which have been agglomerated either directly by compression or by the addition of a small quantity of binder.
